RICHARD DUPONT

There's something very satisfying about Dupont's signature collages, in which a photograph is reconstructed from strips, some of which are duplicated to lengthen a tall man or widen a plump woman; the technique multiplies a subject's essence. The sculptures beside them, faithful models of Wilhelm Reich's Orgone Accumulator and Orgone Shooter, claim to do the same to real people: Reich said they could "collect, accumulate, and make available" life energy, or Orgone Energy, which the mystical scientist believed was the same shade of blue as the sky.
